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### **MMUST TRAINS STAFF ON SIGN LANGUAGE**



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Sign language is one of the Kenya's national languages after English, Kiswahili and mother tongue. MMUST is a public institution established on the University Act, Guidelines and Procedures from the Ministry of Education and the University Governing Council. Every public and private university must have a staff/s that has greater knowledge understanding on the Kenya's forth language and MMUST embraced the initiative and trained five staff on Kenya Sign Language (KSL) for a period of three months in 2018. This was the University initiative to train staff that will, in turn, help in the interpretation during University graduations and other University meetings and events.

The students have finished the Basic Introduction which is the first phase of training and it has been planned and approved by the University that they shall continue with the second phase-Advanced Certificate- of training at the beginning of January 2019.

This will help to increase information accessibility to the persons with disability with hearing impairments and this shows that the university considers the rights to information of each and everyone within the institution without any discrimination or biasness as required by the Kenya Constitution 2010.



# Workshop Tackles Alarming Rate of Drop Outs From Graduate

Graduate students and Faculty supervisors were part of a workshop that took place on 29<sup>th</sup> November, 2018 at Masinde Muliro University of Science and Technology.

The workshop focused on the alarming rate of drop outs and ways maintaining motivation of in Graduate school. Faculty supervisors' session tackled best practices for successful supervision of Graduate research. It was facilitated by Prof. Beatrice Adera, interim department chair and coordinator of student teaching supervision, Westchester University, USA (Department of Special Education).Prof. Beatrice Adera has been on sabbatical leave at The University and works with masters students in research.

During the workshop, graduate students were given tips for quality research papers. Prof. Adera said that research is a big part of graduate school. However, it is expensive and most libraries are not fully stocked .She encouraged the students to take advantage of free online resources on sites such as Google Scholar. Also present were Dr. Kennedy Bota and Dr. Peter Odera (Chairman of the Department of education and psychology at MMUST. Dr. Kennedy urged the students to make use of the current research books recently added to the library.

Prof. Adera said that students need to be supervised by experts in their fields. Faculty supervisors were urged to provide quality mentoring and support by fostering intellectual development of their students. Dr. Odera added that both graduate students and faculty supervisors had their respective roles to play in ensuring there is a collaborative partnership between them. He urged the students to be focused and aggressive, follow up with their lecturers and avoid unnecessary truancy. He said that there was a need to hold more of such workshops.



# Review of the University Performance Contract

Masinde Muliro University of Science and Technology's managers met on Wednesday, 28<sup>th</sup> November, 2018 to evaluate the University's performance for the year ending 30<sup>th</sup> June, 2018. The performance was measured in terms of whether the institution had achieved its targets or not, in the areas of finance stewardship and fiscal discipline, service delivery, core mandate among others.

The Executive Office of the President is responsible for evaluating performance contracts in all universities in Kenya. MMUST expects to be evaluated on 6<sup>th</sup> December, 2018. The presidency has developed an online performance management and tracking system whereby universities can key in data based on self-evaluation. This information should be backed up with hard evidence for government's evaluation purpose.

Mr Andrew Chekulesi from Sigalagala polytechnic gave a demonstration of how to use the software. The platform has been divided into six sections; *Targets, Vetting, Monitoring, Self-evaluation, Moderation and Reports.*

The Directorate of Research and Postgraduate Support (DRPS) has organized a postgraduate seminar for staff and students on 04<sup>th</sup> to 06<sup>th</sup> December 2018.
