- On 14th September 2022, a team of sugarcane researchers led by the Principal Investigator (PI), Prof. Leonard Wamocho, paid a courtesy call to the Vice Chancellor at his office to brief him on the proposed research project that will soon be launched at the University. The intention is to produce sugarcane seedlings through vegetative production. Such seedlings have no disease and hence the sugarcane produced will have less diseases leading to increased per acre production.
