- Masinde Muliro University of Science and Technology (MMUST) students are among the five thousand five hundred (5,500) students set to benefit from the 'Future Makers Inclusive Employability' programme by Light for the World (LFTW) organization. This was evident during the project's official launch at Shieywe Guest House, Kakamega on 28<sup>th</sup> June, 2022. The event was coordinated through MMUST's Directorate of Career Services led by the Director, Dr. Teresa Okoth.
- On 29<sup>th</sup> June, 2022, the Vice Chancellor met the High Commissioner to the United Kingdom (UK), H.E Amb. Dr. Manoah Esipisu and Mrs. Waithiegeni Esipisu.
